



Budget Estimation Worksheet

Setting a budget can be one of the most challenging parts of a renovation project. After all, clients are not often aware of all the pieces that must come together for a room to look and function at its best. Because there is a vast difference in pricing, depending on many factors, I have designed this exercise to help clients figure out a reasonable budget range for their decorating project. It is meant to give you a general idea of what you are comfortable spending on each item for your project. The final budget will most likely be different depending on add-on features and upgrades.

How to use this worksheet

In the empty boxes next to each item for each room, give an estimate of what you think each item will cost – indicate a price for Good, Better and Best options. “Good” which means decent quality but not necessarily unique; “Better” which means better quality with some custom options; and “Best” which means great quality and craftsmanship with custom options.

Each item may require multiple pieces (for example, we may need 2 sofas), so be sure to price both. For items like pillows, accessories and window treatments, write the amount of what you think it will cost for the entire room.

Total your estimates and that should give you a good idea of what can be accomplished on your budget. I encourage you to research a bit to see what some of these items cost based on the quality.

Please note that we will define the actual budget later on in the process after our final selections are made. This is simply a guide to help determine a budget
